Methodology: face-to-face

1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Respondents in the UK consider climate change to be the third most serious problem facing the world (14%, +2 percentage points since 2013), after poverty, hunger and lack of drinking water (30%) and international terrorism (28%, well above the EU average of 19%). An above-average proportion of respondents say that there is a collective responsibility for tackling climate change (UK: 23%, EU average: 16%).

Personal efforts taken to tackle climate change include:

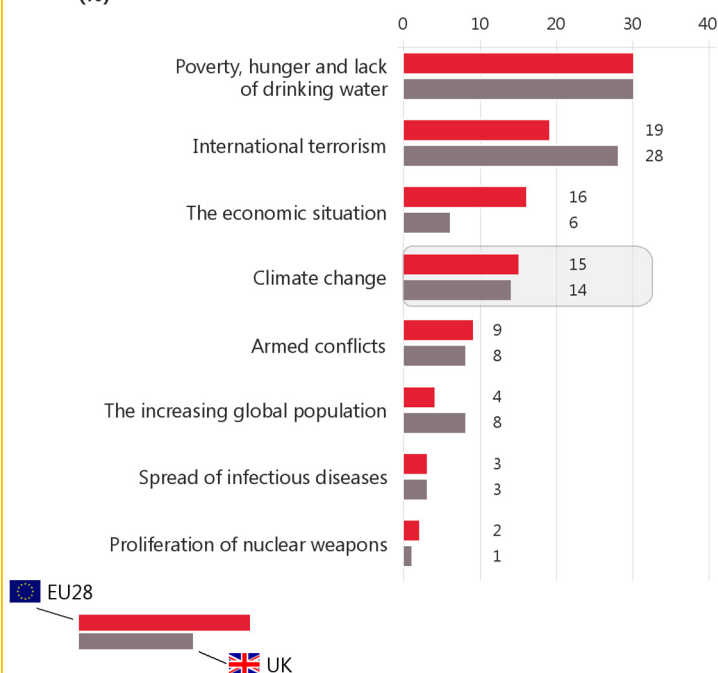
- Trying to cut down waste and separate it for recycling (79%)
- Trying to cut down the use of disposable items such as plastic bags (52%)
- Buying locally produced and seasonal food (43%)
- Choosing energy-efficient new household appliances (38%)
- Using environmentally-friendly alternatives to private cars, such as walking, cycling, taking public transport or car-sharing (38%)
- Improving home insulation to reduce energy consumption (UK: 41%, EU: 23%)

An overwhelming majority (93%) agree that fighting climate change will only be effective if all countries of the world act together.

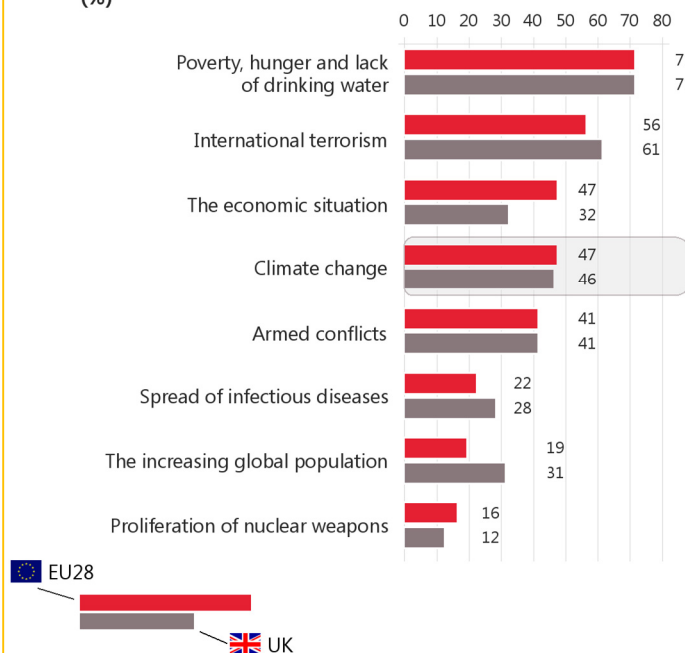
More than nine out of ten (91%) respondents in the UK – close to the overall EU result – agree it is important for the government to set targets to increase the amount of renewable energy used by 2030.

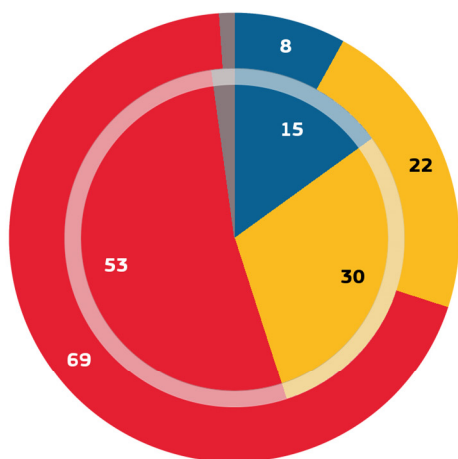

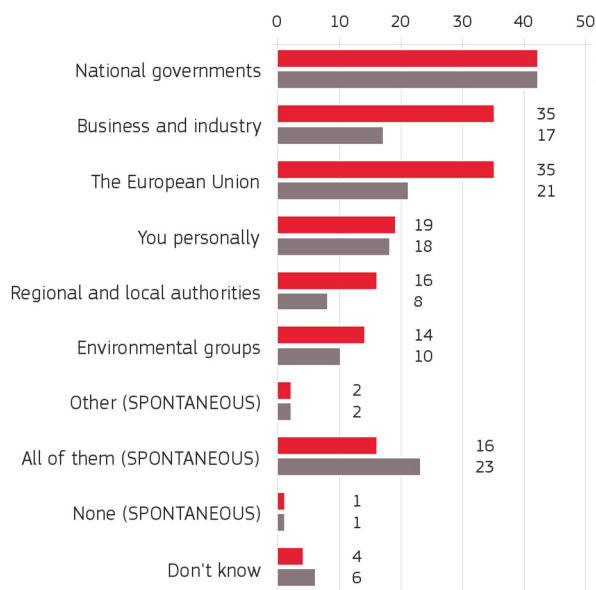

QA3 In your opinion, who within the EU is responsible for tackling climate change? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

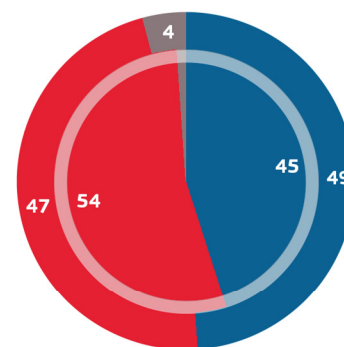

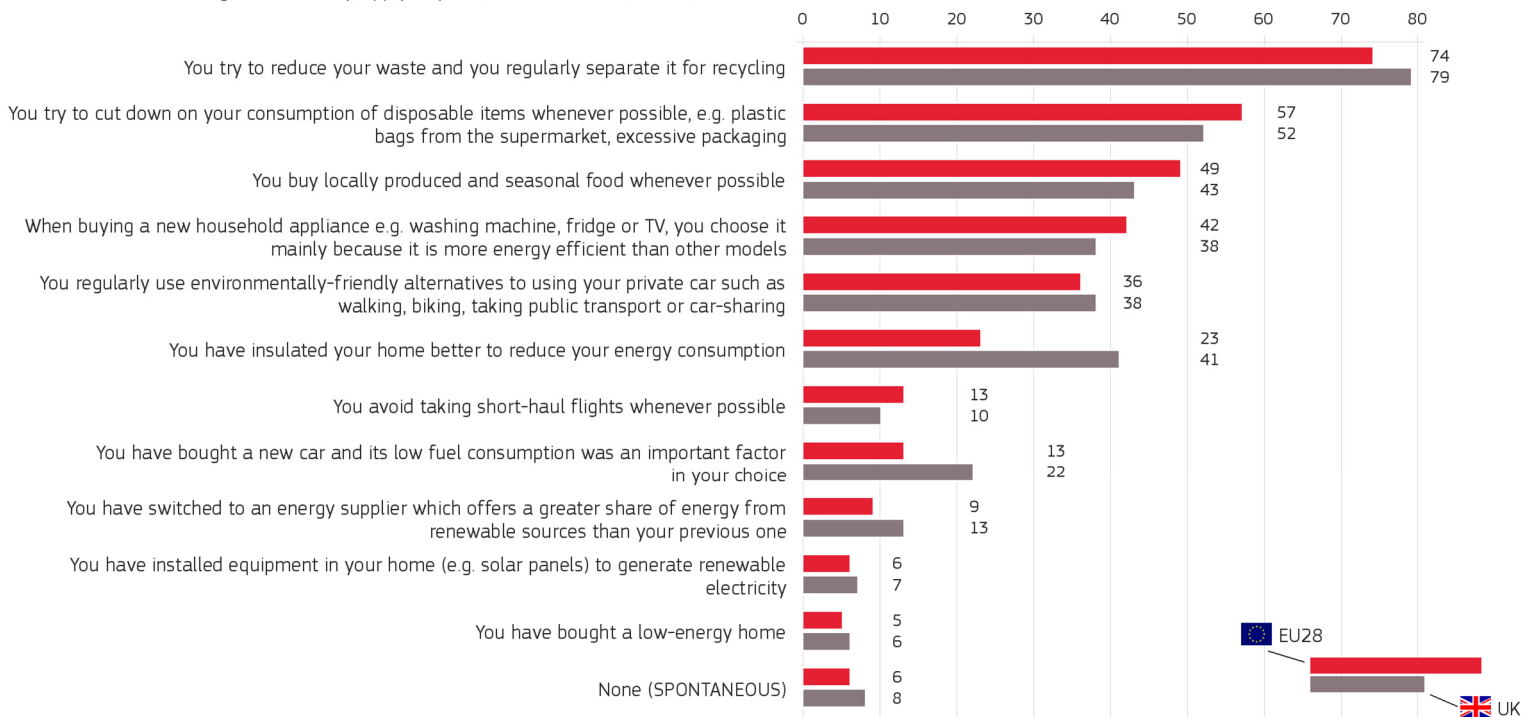

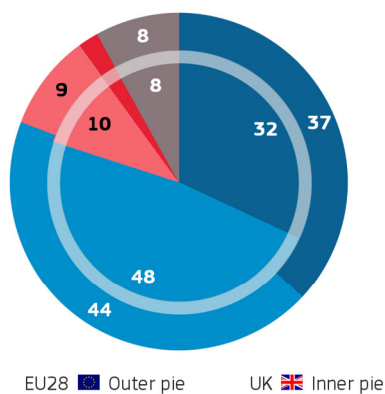
QA6 Which of the following actions, if any, apply to you? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

QA4.1 To what extent do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements?

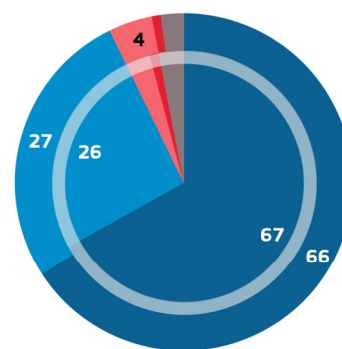
Fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently can boost the economy and jobs in the EU (%)

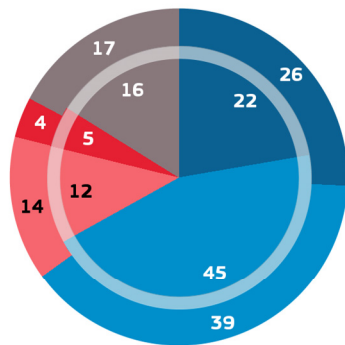

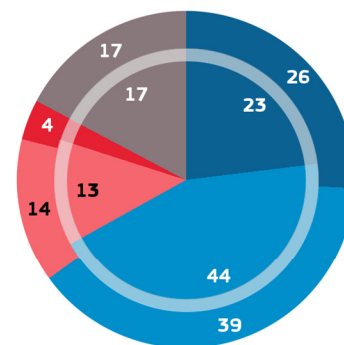
QA4.3 To what extent do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements?

Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can increase the security of EU energy supplies (%)

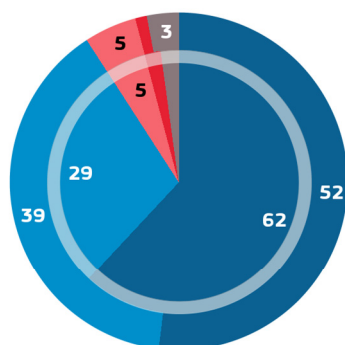

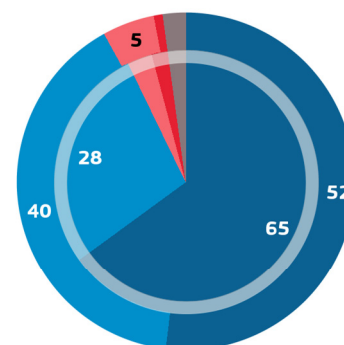
QA7 How important do you think it is that the (NATIONALITY) government sets targets to increase the amount of renewable energy used, such as wind or solar power, by 2030? (%)
